

When a paper is submitted to **TROPICS**, it is assumed that the work has not been published elsewhere and that the paper is not being simultaneously submitted to another journal. **TROPICS** accepts full papers (scientific papers), short papers (scientific papers with fewer than 4 pages when printed), field notes, selected papers from symposium, reviews and monograph are also available. A contribution will be critically reviewed by two reviewers regarding the suitability of the manuscript for publication in **TROPICS**. The Editorial Committee reserves the right to make the final decision on the acceptance or rejection of the manuscript.



Instruction to authors

TROPICS is published by Japan Society of Tropical Ecology as an international journal. Manuscript preferably in Englsh (or Japanese) should be sent to the editor-in-chief. When a paper is submitted to **TROPICS**, it is assumed that the work has not been published elsewhere and that the paper is not being simultaneously submitted to another journal. TROPICS accepts full papers (scientific papers), short papers (scientific papers with fewer than 4 pages when printed), field notes, selected papers from symposium, reviews and monograph are also available. A contribution will be critically reviewed by two reviewers regarding the suitability of the manuscript for publication in **TROPICS**. The Editorial Committee

reserves the right to make the final decision on the acceptance or rejection of the manuscript.

1. Make your manuscript using Microsoft Word (Windows version). Manuscript should be written in double-spaced throughout, and with a wide margin (more than 2 cm). Send your manuscript by attached file to Editorial committee. Tables and figures are expected to be sent as one pdf file. You can also make high resolution jpeg file for tables and figures. If you are not affordable to send an original and one hard copy of them

by mail. We are able to accept up to 3 MB file.

2. Do not include your table, figure, and photo in the text. Prepare them separately in a page. Please make a complete figure and photo.

3. English abstract is required for Japanese submission.

4. A cover page is required which includes the name of the corresponding author including address, telephone number, facsimile number, and e-mail address, a title, a running title, keywords, numbers of text pages, tables, figures and photos, and the date of submission.

5. Following acceptance, a copy of the manuscript (text, tables, figures and photos if affordable) must be submitted on disk.

6. Fifty reprints will be supplied by actual expense 5,000 yen (JPY). The author will be charged for additional reprint orders at 5,000 yen (JPY).

7. Authors are charged additionally for color pages with photos and figures. The rate is 10,000 yen (JPY) per page.
